quickly turned to the accomplishments of the Chelsea's Light Foundation. They are passionate about protecting children and inspiring positive change in communities. Their most important accomplishment was enactment Chelsea's Law. Signed unanimously into law in September, 2010, the California legislation ensures that the state does everything it can to keep sex offenders who target children from engaging in even more atrocious crimes upon release, and that those who commit the worst violent sexual crimes against children are put away for life. The law increases penalties, parole provisions, and oversight for the worst of the worst sex offenders in society — the violent sexual predator who attacks children.

The Finish Chelsea's Run event is the primary fundraiser for the Sunflower Academic Scholarship Fund and the Joie de Vivre or "joy of life" scholarships that enable children with financial need to experience the joy of extracurricular activities that they otherwise couldn't afford.

The Members of Old Mission Rotary were deeply touched and inspired by this program.

The Four-Way Test

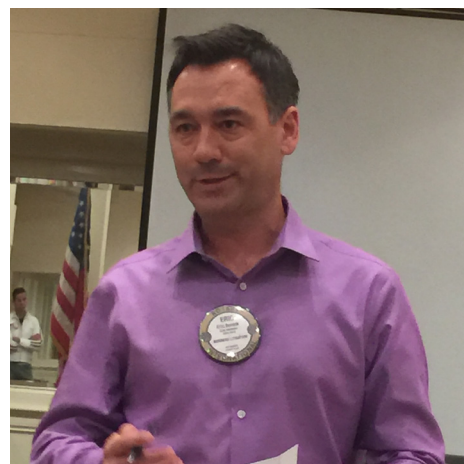
