

San Diego International Airport Tour

On February 2nd, Old Mission Rotary met off site at the San Diego Regional Airport! Club members assembled at the state of the art Shipley Media Center in Terminal 2. This state of the art conference room is ready at any time to accommodate the press and media in the event of a big news story unfolding at the airport. For the first time, San Diego International topped 20 million passengers in 2015. It is the busiest single-runway commercial airport in the United States. The top five carriers in San Diego, by seat capacity, are Southwest Airlines (42.7%), American Airlines (14.0%), United Airlines (11.2%), Alaska Airlines (10.1%), and Delta Air Lines (9.9%).



Keith Wilschetz is the Director of Airport Planning and Noise Mitigation at the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority. Keith spoke to the club about future upgrades and expansion at the San Diego airport.

The airport has domestic flights, as well as international flights to Canada, the United Kingdom, Mexico, and Japan. Our very own Stan Vogelsang is a veteran of the new JAL non stop service between San Diego and Tokyo-Narita with their Boeing 787 Dreamliners. Club members started the tour with a behind the scenes look at the runway in our very own bus. Our guide was Airport Customer Relations Coordinator Colm Marmion. Colm discussed airport operations and pointed out highlights such as the fire station, fuel farm and Kings Air private jet facility. We also saw

Colm pointed that the single runway is 9400 feet long. Colm also noted that the old Commuter Terminal is now and administration building and that commuter flights have been moved to gates in Terminals One and Two.

Manager of Terminal Operations, Amiel Porta, escorted our group into the terminal baggage processing area where we were amazed at the automation and speed of the operation. Thousands of bags were flying around on conveyer belts as they were being scanned for explosive materials. Many bags have to be delivered from check in to the aircraft in 30 minutes! We continued on a TSA inspection area where bags that failed screening were checked by hand. In many cases, food stuffs such as peanut butter and hot sauce set off detectors

Lunch was a delicious buffet and our program was a presentation on future development of the airport by Keith Wilschetz who is the Director of Airport Planning and Noise Mitigation at the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority. Soon, a 3000 space multi level parking garage will replace the surface lot at Terminal Two. A new Terminal One replacement plan will cost 2.2 billion over the next ten years. A beautified Middletown Trolley station at Palm Street is expected to be completed next year to serve transit riders who will be able to walk from there to the rental car shuttle buses down the hill. Future plans will double the airport's capacity to about 28 million passengers a year.

Medical Minute



Dr. Kevin Glynn regularly reports on the latest news in medicine. The New England Journal of *Medicine this week reports results* of the SPRINT trial for high blood pressure. This involved treating patients to a target blood pressure of 120/80 rather than 140/90. More than 9,000 people enrolled in the study. All were at increased risk for cardiovascular disease due to hypertension. The study went on for three years and then was halted because the lower blood pressure group had significantly fewer heart attacks, episodes of heart failure, and strokes. No excess of fainting spells or falls due to blood pressure being too low were observed in the more aggressively treated group. Most of the patients needed three or four drugs to get to target blood pressures.

The conclusion of the study is that hypertension should be treated aggressively, with a goal of 120/80 in most people, even if three or four drugs are required to reach that objective.
