Our club judges were Bob James, Barry Williamson, Dr. Kevin Glynn, Bill Turnquist and Omar Calleros. Our contestants all participate in the Reality Changers program that assists inner city youth get to college. Every Rotarian in the room was impressed by our three contestants. Their common theme was the struggle against violence, poverty and despair in the inner city neighborhood of City Heights. Each contestant realized that education was the key to their future success.

Katherine Willey served as the emcee of our club 4-Way Test Speech Contest. She advised our contestants that it is good to be a little nervous but not good to be paralyzed by fear. In between speakers, Katherine kept us entertained with famous funny political quotes or "Hooverisms."

Our first speaker was Huy Nguyen. He compared his life journey to the bus trip he makes every day from his inner city neighborhood to school in the suburbs. He left Vietnam at the age of ten and is very grateful to the hard work of his parents. He emphasized that in the United States, education has value not just because it enriches the individual but because it benefits our society.

Our second speaker was Daniel Rios and he discussed the 4-Way Test as it relates to the violence surrounding his life in the inner city. Daniel witnessed gunfire and stabbings routinely while growing up. He struggled to get an education despite temptations and pressures to abandon school. He is determined to succeed.

Rosa Olascoaga noted that the background sounds of her youth were gunfire, sirens and police helicopters! Her epiphany came when she met Michelle Obama during the first lady visit to City Heights. She was so inspired that she is now dedicated to her education and to improving her community. Rosa was very active in bringing a skate park to City Heights.

The Reality Changers program was well represented by the three high school seniors that participated in our 4-Way Test Speech contest. Old Mission Rotary was thrilled to hear their stories and we wish them the very best of luck as they finish their senior year of high school and move on to college!
