Art Pratt Foundation of Old Mission Rotary Grant to St. Madeleine Sophie's Center

St. Madeleine Sophie's Center is located in El Cajon on an idyllic six acre campus of gardens, school buildings and a pool.

St. Madeleine Sophie's Center provides programs to adults who have developmental disabilities, such as autism, Down syndrome, and cerebral palsy. While there are no cures for developmental disabilities, people with these cognitive disorders can still achieve personal and professional fulfillment.

The staff combines a culture of care and creativity within quality programs to provide liberal arts education, practical skills development, employment and dignity for a lifetime. Innovative programs include living skills, vocational training such as culinary arts and computers, linguistics, aquatics, gardening and performing arts. Their artwork program is so successful that now students showcase their talents at Sophie's Art Gallery in a separate storefront in downtown El Cajon! Members of Old Mission Rotary were very impressed by the passion of our speakers: Joe Perruca and Laura Purdom and were thrilled to support St. Madeleine Sophie's Center with an Art Pratt grant.

Dr. Stephan Waterman Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever



Dr. Steve Waterman spoke briefly to the club about his work to combat Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever. He is a Medical Epidemiologist at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and has recently been posted to Southern California. He is also a member of the Downtown San Diego Rotary Club.

Rocky Mountain spotted fever is a potentially fatal disease caused by the bite of a tick infected with rickettsia group bacteria. The ticks live on dogs and the problem has become extremely serious in northern Baja including the San Quentin community that our VIIDAI public health program serves. Dr. Waterman has proposed supplying and putting on specially treated collars on all dogs in northern Baja to include strays. The pesticides on the collar will kill the ticks. Old Mission Rotary is planning to participate in a Rotary Global Grant to fund this effort.
