On February 23rd, Hernán Luis y Prado of Workshops for Warriors thanked Old Mission Rotary for the Art Pratt Foundation Grant of \$25,000. This donation came at a key moment when the program desperately needed an industrial ventilation system to continue operating. The money from the Art Pratt Foundation was combined with other matching grants and the improved facility doubled the number of students in the program. Workshops for Warriors prepares veterans and wounded warriors for advanced manufacturing careers, to meet the strong demand for skilled labor in the welding and fabricating industries. They provide stateof-the-art training, industry recognized credentials, work experience and job placement — all at no cost to veterans.
