Corona Conversation

At today's Corona Conversation, club member Don Krupp gave an update on COVID-19 vaccination progress, in light of the fact that over half a million Americans have now died since the pandemic began a year ago.. He noted that worldwide some 212 million doses have been given, with 64 million shots delivered in the United States. Israel has done the best job of getting vaccines into people's arms with a whopping 87 doses per one hundred individuals. The United States is at about 19.5 doses per one hundred.

The vaccines have proven to be remarkably safe with no known fatalities associated with them. Rates of allergic reactions, at about four cases per million doses, have been less than half of what was predicted. Of the 64 million doses given nationally, 19.4 million have received their second shot.

Here in San Diego County we have administered 742,000 doses with 193,000 having received their second booster dose.

Though the post-holiday winter surge in cases appears to be slowing, doctors advise now is not the time to be complacent. Case rates are still about where they were in late summer and could easily be induced into another deadly surge.

So don't let your guard down. Keep wearing your mask and respecting physical distancing guidelines. Avoid large gatherings and wash your hands frequently.
