San Diego County Sheriffs Department



The San Diego County Sheriff Bill Gore spent 32 years with the FBI and has been with the Sheriff's Department since 2004.

Sheriff Bill Gore oversees one of the largest law enforcement agencies in the nation. His field deputies patrol a jurisdiction with over 4,200 square miles, while detectives investigate homicide, sex crimes, gang violence, elder abuse, and fraud. He oversees jail operations which prior to Corona virus, averaged 5600 inmates at seven different detentions facilities. Responsible for a staff of 4,300 and an annual budget of over \$970 million, Sheriff Gore spearheaded creation of the Regional Terrorism Threat Assessment Center (RT-TAC), developed the highly effective Homeless Assisted Resource Team (HART) and expanded the San Diego Sheriff Continued on Page 2

RISE Up Industries is a nonprofit that prepares the formerly incarcerated for careers as CNC (Computer Numerical Control) machine operators in their full service machine shop. Former enemy gang members and convicts work side by side, helping one another to complete the Reentry Program and make positive life choices. The kinship they have fostered is an inspiration and proof that training and rehabilitation work!. Graduates of the program typically find immediate employment. The Art Pratt Foundation presented a grant of \$4094 to purchase a bead blasting machine that us used to smooth manufactured parts for anodizing. Joe Calbreath is a member of their board of directors and accepted the funds and showed us an engraved plaque that will mounted on the Bead Blaster Machine.

Sheriff's air operations to include three fire-fighting helicopters. A second-generation San Diegan, Bill Gore graduated from Crawford High School and the University of San Diego. He joined the FBI and rose to the rank of Assistant Director, where he oversaw strategic planning, internal affairs, and inspections for the entire Bureau. His extraordinary efforts earned him the Meritorious Executive Award from the President of the United States.

In an extensive Q&A session, Sheriff Gore stated that his biggest issue at the moment is civil unrest. He is determined to let the public demonstrate and exercise freedom of speech but also has the responsibility to keep the peace. Domestic Terrorism from the right and the left is also a major concern.
