### Can American Manufacturing be Saved?



Michele Nash-Hoff splashed cold water in our faces with a frightening report on the state of manufacturing in America!

Michele Nash-Hoff has been in and out of San Diego's high-tech manufacturing industry since starting as an engineering secretary at age 18. Michele is founder and president of ElectroFab Sales, a sales agency specializing in helping manufacturers select the right processes for their products. Michele is the author of *Can American Manufacturing be Saved? Why we should and how we can.* 

Michele presented a fascinating history of American manufacturing from colonial times to the post WWII world super power glory days and into the present where American manufacturing is on the wane. Since 2000, our manufacturing sector has declined dramati-

cally. For example, textiles have fallen 63%, communications 47%, motor vehicles 43%, machine tooling 60% and printed circuit boards 74%. Michele focused on the contribution manufacturing makes to the U. S. economy, how manufacturing jobs are the foundation of the middle class. Manufacturing jobs pay significantly more than service jobs and the manufacturing industry serves as an engine of technology. One of her main points was that the loss of our manufacturing sector threatens our national security particularly with regards to an expanding China, Loss of manufacturing is directly related to booming federal and state deficits. The United States has fallen behind China and Germany in exports of manufactured goods. What can be done to save American manufacturing by government, industry, and individuals? Michele asked us all to buy American products and to specifically boycott Chinese goods. Lydia Stewart noted this is difficult when such retailers as Walmart stock their stores with cheap Chinese merchandise! Michele asked us to put pressure on politicians who are often well funded by multi-national corporations with no loyalty to the United States. Can American Manufacturing be saved? After Michele's presentation the answer is maybe!

#### The Medical Minute



Dr. Kevin Glynn shared some interesting medical news from the latest Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA).

Stroke occurs more often in women than in men and is their third leading cause of death (the fifth leading cause in men). Kevin noted that female hormones have been linked to higher stroke rates in women.

Public health investigators traced the largest US outbreak of fungal endophthalmitis to environmental mold that contaminated medications produced by a Florida compounding pharmacy. Kevin explained that compounding pharmacies create specific pharmaceutical products to fit the unique needs of patients. Unfortunately, Compounding Pharmacies have been linked to contamination problems when they are tasked with manufacturing mass quantities of standard drugs.

Kevin noted that Whole-genome sequencing (WGS) is increasingly being applied in clinical medicine and is expected to uncover clinically significant findings. It is hoped that WGS will alert individuals to the risk for many medical conditions. Kevin himself had genome testing and did indeed develop macular degeneration as predicted. Recent research shows that genome testing is still an infant science and not completely reliable.
