backgrounds and inner city neighborhoods that are typically underrepresented on college campuses. Reality Changers advance equal education opportunities in our region and beyond.

The founder, Chris Yanov, used money he won on the TV game show Wheel of Fortune to launch his dream! Reality Changers has a 98% success rate of getting participants into college.

CEO Tamara Cravens told us that their goal is to identify the 2.0 student in eighth grade and get them into the program to unlock their hidden potential. She had thought that the need for the Reality changers program might diminish with time but now realizes that there will always be a need to assist disadvantaged kids living in tough neighborhoods and family situations.

Several Old Mission Rotarians have served as one on one mentors and tutors over the years.

Aimee

Speaker A noted that minority students are disproportionately targeted for discipline in public schools. Aimee advocated for Restorative Justice which is an approach to justice where one of the responses to a school infraction is to organize a meeting between the staff and the student offender,

Aimee attends Helix Charter School. She is a dedicated dancer and has studied ballet for many years. Her inspiration is her mom and she is passionate about promoting woman's rights. Aimee would like to study psychology at Brown University.

Vianca

Speaker B was passionate that every individual must discover their identity including their ethnic roots. In Vianca's case she embraces her *chicanismo* and the identification of Chicanos with their Indigenous American roots.

Vianca is a student at Mission Bay High School. She is passionate about social justice and hopes to attend the University of California Santa Cruz.

Ricardo Cardenas

Speaker C struggles with ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder) Ricardo did not want to define himself by his condition and he stressed that with proper medical attention and planned school curriculum, people with ADHD can be happy and productive. He implored us to show kindness and open hearts to those struggling with the condition.

Ricardo is a sophomore at Patrick Henry High School and enjoys math and engineering. He loves to read and to play volleyball. His inspiration is an aunt who always insisted he focus on his education and helped him seek treatment for ADHD. In college he wants to study psychology.

Khadija

Speaker D advocated the need to expose and reverse wrongful convictions in our legal system. Sadly, the majority of wrongful convictions affect people of color or the poor.

Khadija and her family are from Mali in central Africa. She enjoys the culture and native dances of her homeland. Khadija attends Crawford High School and plans to attend San Diego State University and work toward a law degree.
