Do you know where you can find a signed proclamation from President Abraham Lincoln giving Mission San Luis Rey back to the Catholic church in the 1860s? - 450 cubic feet of official records dating from 1848-1959
- 170,000 sheets of maps
- 116 cubic feet of Birth, Death and Marriage records from 1849 to 1986.

On March 8th, Brian Dempsey related an amazing story from a ski trip in the Italian Alps in 1986 when he was stationed in Naples with the US Navy. Brian had just checked into the Hotel Albergo da Compagnoni in Breuil-Cervinia at the foot of the majestic Matterhorn. when a very unassuming older man grabbed Brian's bags and carried them upstairs. The porter was none other than Achille Compagnoli, the owner of the hotel and one of the greatest Italian mountaineers of all time. He was the first to summit K-2 in 1954 which is the second highest mountain in the world. Achille later took a great interest in Brian's Norweigian Telemark skis.
