Caitriona Tilden, Ph.D. discussed Mental Health and Suicide Prevention at our April 5th meeting. Caitriona Tilden, Ph.D., is a Clinical Psychology Fellow at the San Diego VA/UCSD Consortium. Her job and passion is serving veterans at the San Diego VA Center of Recovery Education. She provides evidence-based, recovery-oriented care to Veterans with serious mental health concerns, specifically those who are experiencing psychosis. Cait discussed differences between depression, bipolar behavior and schizophrenia. These conditions are often amplified by PTSD and by alcohol and drug use. Chances are, we all know someone who has struggled with mental health challenges and suicide. At our luncheon meeting on Tuesday, April 5th we learned about these challenges and where to find resources for help.
