At this week's Corona Conversation, club member Don Krupp shared important news that San Diego County has administered over one million vaccinations with nearly 23% of the county population now fully vaccinated.

There are some 150 locations in San Diego County now offering coronavirus vaccinations in some form or another.

Still for those who have yet to be vaccinated, navigating the various means and mechanisms for getting your shot scheduled can, at times, be frustrating. To help a Facebook Group has been started that has become a forum to share information and tips about how to find and schedule a vaccine appointment.

If you're on Facebook search for "San Diego Vaccine Hunters."

All of this is important because we are seeing the emergence of a fourth viral surge in some parts of the country involving some of the new more virulent variants. Some of these are showing more serious effects on a younger, healthier portion of the population. We've been spared from a fourth surge so far in San Diego and California is seeing the lowest case positivity rate in the country. But if past experience is any guide we can expect cases to rise again here. Let's hopes hope that's not the case.

In the meantime, schedule your vaccination, wear a mask, keep your distance from others, avoid large indoor gatherings and wash your hands frequently.

ing the president.

In addition to its ominous origins, the Electoral College was surely not what the Founding Fathers would have wanted. They had already spelled out the electoral process in the Constitution, designed as such to be a more democratic system than it is today. Thus, the Electoral College is not reflective of a true democracy in which the people directly decide their leaders.

The system overrepresents some states and under represents others, creating campaigns that focus on a few "swing states." Five times in our history, a presidential candidate has WON the popular vote but LOST the Electoral College count:

- 1. Hilary Clinton (2016)
- 2. Al Gore (2000)
- 3. Grover Cleveland (1888)
- 4. Samuel Tilden (1876)
- 5. Andrew Jackson (1824)

One dirty secret of the Electoral College is the direct relationship to racism and slavery in this country. More specifically, southern states wanted enslaved persons to count toward the population for the purposes of political representation, even when those in slavery had no voting rights or voice in government.

The three-fifths compromise allowed for three-fifths of slaves to be counted which resulted in more representatives in the U.S. House of Representatives and more votes in the Electoral College. The system rewarded slave owners by giving their states more power while holding millions and millions of people powerless.

In a lively Q&A, club member Jerry Hosenkamp noted that the Constitution only discussed a republic and made no reference to democracy. If you are a fan of the Electoral College then stand by for a future program when a speaker will argue for its continuation.
