Model United Nations

Ten years ago our district's Pathways to Peace Committee launched the Model United Nations program. High school students are trained to be effective negotiators by debating current-day international issues that are presently being addressed at the United Nations. The 10th annual Model UN Conference, which simulates a United Nations General Assembly, will be held at the Kroc Institute for Peace and Justice on the University of San Diego campus on April 12 and 13, 2014. District 5340 is the only district in the United States that puts on a Model UN program! This year we will host four teams from Mexico, students from San Diego, Riverside and Imperial Counties. The Model UN program is one of our district's hallmark Youth Service events each

year. This year we are fortunate to have former Bangladesh Ambassador to the United Nations Anwarul Chowdhury as the keynote speaker at the Saturday (April 12) evening banquet at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Mission Valley.

Old Mission Rotary sponsored two students from Clairemont High School. Senior Cole McDaniel and junior Rachel Reams will be role playing the United Kingdom at the Model UN. They will also be introducing and advocating resolutions on cyber warfare and the Sudan. Their coach and Rotarian advisor is Bunmi Esho, from the Mission Valley Sunset Rotary Club. Internet Care Sites

Nearly $\frac{3}{4}$ of Americans complain they have difficulty obtaining non-emergency care on nights or weekends. E-visit websites are arising to meet this demand and are attracting venture capital investors. They offer customers a virtual medical appointment, usually via-e mail. Advantages are convenience and speed. Disadvantages are that they purvey episodes of care, without follow-up, and are limited because of inability to see and physically examine the patient. Most assert their service does not constitute a physician-patient relationship. Many of these websites also sell products, such as additional wellness profiles and nutritional supplements. The American Telemedicine Association is attempting to develop standard practice guidelines for these entities, which will likely continue to grow because they do give people a service they desire, and often truly need.
