Our speaker on Tuesday, April 13th was Kent Lee. Executive Director of the Pacific Arts Movement here in San Diego. The Pacific Arts Movement is one of the largest media arts organizations in North America focusing on Asian American and Asian international cinema, Pac Arts is best known for presenting the annual San Diego Asian Film Festival. In addition to be a leading voice on behalf of the expression of Asian culture in our community, The Pacific Arts Movement is taking a stand to denounce xenophobia, racism, and increasing acts of violence targeted towards Asian, Asian American, and Pacific Islander communities both locally and nationally.

The Corona Conversation with Don Krupp is a weekly feature now included in our Old Mission Rotary Zoom Meetings.

There was big news with the Johnson & Johnson "one shot" vaccine being linked to blood clots. My answer is simply that it is not known if the six cases of blood clotting were caused by the vaccine but the CDC is taking the right precautionary measures. If there is a relationship, less than one case in a million inoculations means it's an extremely rare occurrence. Unvaccinated individuals are 2,000 times more likely to die from COVID-19 than they are to experience blood clots from the vaccine.

Still the CDC and FDA are doing the right thing pausing use of the J&J vaccine.

District 5340 Funds Support Old Mission Rotary Youth Projects!

The Old Mission Rotary Club foundation allocated \$1,500 for Model UN, and \$5,200 for RYLA from the District 5340 Grant money. Both youth programs have been made virtual with no expense and so Old Mission Rotary will then re-allocate these funds:

• Copley-Price YMCA (\$3,650) for Scholarships so disadvantaged children may participate in YMCA events.

• Boys & Girls Clubs of San Diego County (\$3,500) for Scholarships so disadvantaged children may participate in Boys & Girls Club events.

• San Diego Convention Center Shelter for unaccompanied migrant girls (\$500). The funds will be used for books for the school for the Spanish speaking girls.

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is a leadership program coordinated by Rotary Clubs around the globe. Each year, thousands of young people participate in this program. Young people are sponsored by Rotary Clubs to attend RYLA events run by the each of the Rotary Districts.

In our District 5340, RYLA is a leadership conference for approximately 280 high school juniors. The venue in normal times is Idyllwild Pines Camp. Youth Protection certified club members can volunteer to serve as facilitators for the RYLA weekend.

The primary intent is to encourage students to become more effective community leaders. Students emerge from the training confident, enthusiastic and empowered. The program includes exceptional speakers, small group discussions and fellowship activities all within an atmosphere of trust and respect. Thanks to our club's RYLA Chair, Tom Sandler, Old Mission Rotary traditionally sponsors more than a dozen students each year from high schools such as Crawford, Madison, Francis Parker, Saint Augustine and Our Lady of Peace. Students typically attend an Old Mission Rotary meeting after the event and are always thrilled by their experiences.

RYLA was cancelled last year and will be a virtual event this week from April 15th- 18th.
