Vietnam to the American Dream



Dr. Pha Le spoke at our club meeting on April 18th about his life journey from extreme poverty as a child in communist Vietnam to the the American Dream in the USA. Today, Dr. Pha Le is an emergency room doctor who gives of his time on the front lines of homelessness providing clinical health care services to individuals living on the streets.

His story began as a child in Vietnam from where, in 1982, his family escaped from communism in the middle of the night on a boat. Pha's family came to the United States with nothing and lived in poverty in Los Angeles. Education was his ticket out of the converted garage where his family lived to UCLA and then medical school. Pha is very grateful to American military veterans and is active in the Honor Flight program.

RYLA Rotary commits to Youth

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, or RYLA was once again held in person for the first time in three vears. RYLA had been cancelled and then made virtual due to the COVID Pandemic. The event took place over the weekend of April 14th-16th in an idyllic mountain setting at the Idyllwild Pines Camp. Every year, high school sophomores and juniors are interviewed and sponsored by Rotary clubs to attend the all-expenses-paid weekend experience. RYLA attendees make life-long friends through fellowship activities and discuss the ethical and social issues. Activities are conducted in an atmosphere of trust and respect and the result is that students return to their schools and communities motivated to take on additional leadership roles and to find additional ways to serve. Thanks again to our club's RYLA Chair, Tom Sandler, who organized student interviews and served as a facilitator at the event itself. Old Mission Rotary sponsored and impressive 11 high school juniors from both public and private area high schools including Crawford, Madison, Francis Parker, Saint

Augustine and Our Lady of Peace. Several club members volunteered travelled to these schools to interview and select students for the program.

The students who we sponsored will attend an Old Mission Rotary meeting soon to relate their experiences at RYLA.

April is Maternal and Child Health Month

April is Maternal and Child Health Month. By prioritising Maternal and Child Health month, Rotary improves access to medical services for mothers and their children. These efforts are aimed at reducing the number of children under 5 who die each year because of malnutrition, inadequate health care and poor sanitation - a figure that is currently estimated at 7 million. More than 80% of maternal deaths can be prevented with access to reproduction health services and trained health care workers. Rotary provides education, immunisation, birthing kits and mobile health clinics to support these causes. Women are taught how to prevent motherto-infant HIV transmissions, how to breast feed, and how to protect themselves and their children from disease.
