Tyler Silva organized the Old Mission Rotarians at Work team that also included President Steve Nuñez, Matt Risi, Lydia Stewart and Barry Williamson. The project was organized by **Rebuilding Together San Diego.** This non profit provides critical repairs and renovations for lowincome homeowners across San Diego. Many will remember this organization by their former name Christmas in April. Some fifty volunteers did yard work, painting and cleaning to benefit a Coast Guard veteran that needed a helping hand. Skilled electricians and landscapers did the technical work such as wiring repairs and sprinkler installation. A large group painted part of the inside and all of the exterior of the house. The Rotarian team first helped to clear trash and junk from the property and then later hauled and spread out endless buckets of cedar wood chips in the front yard. The project was well planned by Rebuilding Together San Diego with all of the necessary tools and supplies pre-staged. Our Old Mission Rotary team was very

It has grown from the initial contribution of \$26.50 that Arch put into a hat to more than \$55 million. The Paul Harris Fellowship is one of the largest and most prestigious international fellowship programs in the world.

Susan Taylor-Passionate about Scripps Health

Many of us remember Susan Taylor as the news anchor on the San Diego NBC television station. Susan worked late nights as a newswoman for 15 years until she decided that being a mom was more important. Today Susan is the Executive of External Affairs for Scripps Health. Her Rotary talk focused on the high level of the facilities and services available in the Scripps Health system. Susan was obviously proud to represent a health care system of 14,000 employees that treats 500,000 patients each year. She was excited to tell us about the many prestigious awards and accolades Scripps Health has received for a variety of reasons including state of the art technologies and patient satisfaction.

Susan also talked about the changes under way in health care as medical costs skyrocket and the Affordable Health Care Act is gradually implemented.. We should expect hospital medicine.

Susan was tearful as she recalled her father's open heart surgery at Scripps in 2008. Her mascara even started running as she told the story! Despite severe complications and a forty hour operation, the creative and determined Scripps team not only saved her dad but rehabilitated him over the course of many months. Susan has had a special connection with Scripps Health ever since. Susan discussed Scripps Health pioneering work. For example, proton beam therapy is used to treat cancer and Genomics gives insight into the root causes of disease and ailments We watched videos of a paralyzed patient walking with bionic legs and a robotic surgery where heart surgery was performed remotely by wire. Old Mission Rotary was very impressed by Susan and her sincere passion to educate the public about Scripps Health.
