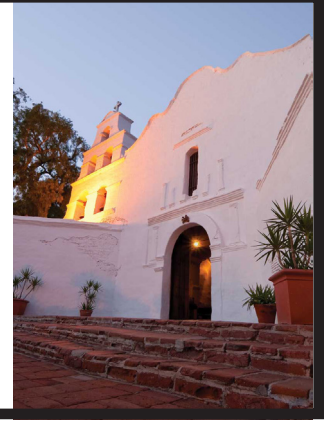

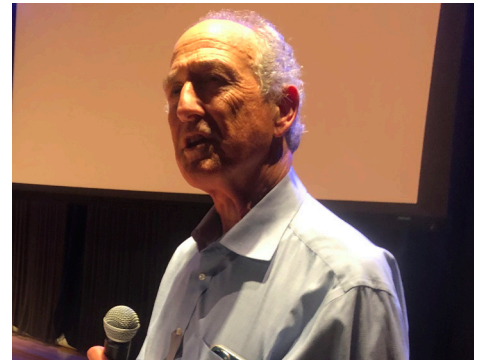
Lu Liu played a traditional Chinese stringed instrument called the Pipa or Chinese lute.



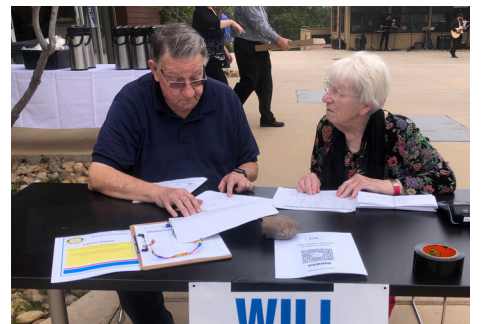
Michele Malin was our Gala and Silent Auction Chair. Her husband Paul and children Joey and Lucy helped with the Silent Auction tables.
