On April 30th, the Art Pratt Foundation of Old Mission Rotary presented a grant of \$8,830 to San Ysidro Health. The non profit provides extraordinary care to those that need help regardless of their insurance coverage, their status or their ability to pay. They serve some 95,000 patients from all walks of life along the border in Otay Mesa. The grant will be used to purchase equipment for Physical Therapy programs in their PACE program for the elderly.
