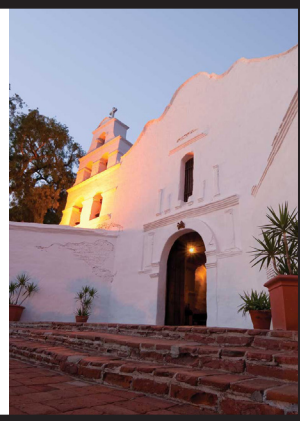

## PB Rotaract Social at the Air Conditioned Lounge

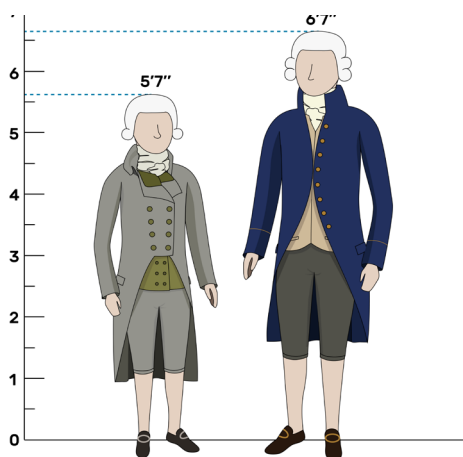

cable industry regulations, treating donors compassionately, and connecting donors to the researchers and educators who depend on them to help improve the lives of others. When it comes to medical research and education, there really is no substitute for the knowledge gained by working with human tissue. Luke explained that MedCure adheres to the highest ethical standards and only works with legitimate medical programs.



William Jenkins was an employee of the Bank of England for nine years in the late 1700s.

Jenkins was 6' 7½" tall and was much taller than the average man at that time, who would have been 5' 7".

Jenkins was terrified that because of his height, his corpse would be stolen by body snatchers following his death and sold to surgeons. The going rate for a skeleton of this size in 1798 was in the region of £25,000 in today's money (\$35,000).

Upon his death in 1798, Jenkins' body was body buried in the Bank of England's very secure Garden Courtyard as was his request.

## Corona Conversation

As we prepare for our first in-person meeting in over a year next Tuesday, I am happy to report that as of June 9, San Diego County has moved into the Yellow Tier, leading towards a further reopening and return to normalcy. The County's "Triggers Dashboard," which monitors its epidemiological, healthcare and public health metrics is currently below critical thresholds for requiring additional public health prescriptions.

Notably, the number of community outbreaks have fallen below the trigger of more than seven in a seven-day period, hospitalizations are down, and case rates are at only 1.2 cases per 100,000 population. This is the first time since the lockdown last year that we've seen numbers this good.

Of course, it's mostly attributable to the vaccines, which are truly making a difference. Here, locally, nearly 1.7 million people have been fully vaccinated, that's 60% of the County's population. The County continues to edge towards its goal of 2.1 individuals being fully vaccinated.

This doesn't mean we can through caution to the wind. But it does

mean we should continue to listen to and follow the advice of our public health professionals. If we continue to do so, there will come a time when our weekly Corona Conversations will no longer be needed.
