At the RI Convention in Hamburg, there were more than 26,000 registrants representing 3,605 Rotary clubs in 170 countries.

Rotary committed \$102 million USD this year to end polio. Hamburg gained €24 million in tourism revenue. Holger Knaack was the first German nominated to serve as Rotary International president in 2020-21. There were 35 speeches and 98 breakout sessions and 334 exhibit booths of which 200 featured Rotary humanitarian projects.
