Niles completed two trips to Lebanon and found the Hezbollah controlled cities of Beirut and Tyre to be friendly and very busy. Tripoli, however, is a Sunni city and was very hostile. Niles is now formulating plans for charitable work in Lebanon. He and his wife just celebrated their 35th wedding anniversary.
