Climate Change



Dr. David Pierce of Scripps Institute of Oceanography presented a sobering program on climate change on June 23rd.

Our program on climate change presented on June 23rd by Dr. David Pierce of Scripps Institute of Oceanography may be the most important program of the year. The phenomenon of global warming was first described by the third Nobel Prize winner in chemistry, over 100 years ago! When the sun's radiation penetrates our atmosphere and reflects off of the surface of the earth it is reflected back into space. Layers of greenhouse gasses trap the reflected energy and reflect it back to the surface. The evidence for global warming is the result of measured air temperature (including aloft), measured ocean temperature (including subsurface), reduction in glaciers, snowpack, and permafrost behavior of plants and animals "proxy indicators" include Borehole temperatures, tree rings and corals. Greenhouse gasses, such as carbon dioxide, warm the planet and atmospheric concentrations are increasing. Roger Revelle started measuring carbon dioxide levels in 1956 and since then these concentrations have increased exponentially. The gasses released by human activity can account for the increased concentration of these gassed and

explain increased air temperature as well as increased ocean temperatures. Natural factors (sun, volcanoes) can account for a medieval warm period, a little ice age and warming in the 1940s but do not match the magnitude of the warming since the 1950s. Other factors such as sun spots and cosmic rays are also discounted as they have been relatively constant over the last century.

Global warming is real and 97% of all climate scientist accept the scientific evidence. Since the start of the Industrial Revolution some 200 years ago, mankind's use of fossil fuels has been damaging our fragile ecosystem. Dr. Pierce urges us to take action!
