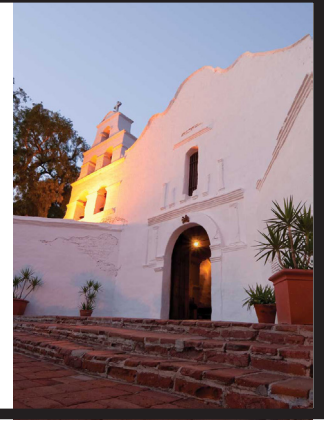

The Airport and our Environment



Chad Reese is the Manager for Environmental Affairs at the San Diego International Airport

The San Diego International Airport sits on 661 acres and handles 22 million passengers a year that travel to 75 destinations. The single runway is the busiest in the world!

On July 18th, Old Mission Rotary members enjoyed a remarkable program on the Environmental Stewardship program at the San Diego International Airport. Chad Reese, Manager of Environmental Affairs, spoke to us about how the airport is working in many areas. Water stewardship involves collection and reuse of stormwater using a new 5 million gallon cistern. Air conditioning condensate is even collected and used to make a beer called Hoppy Travels IPA at a local craft brewery! More and more electrical power generation is solar helping to reduce the airport's carbon footprint. The airport even protects the nesting area of the endangered Least Tern bird.

Our Airport Authority has instituted one of the first sustainability policies for a major airport in the United States and formalized the Airport Authority's commitment to an environmentally sustainable future for the airport and the region.
