

District Grant Approved!



Special thanks to Bob Chalfa for drafting and submitting a grant to our District 5340 to help fund our youth programs. The fund will come from District Designated Funds (DDF) of up to \$4,000 per club. On August 5th the Grant Project P-2967 for Old Mission Rotary was approved by District 5340. This grant will be used to help fund 2 schools, send six students to LEAD in October ,(\$1500), 16 students to RYLA next April ($16 \times $325 = $5,200$), and 4 students and 1 adviser to the 2020 Model UN next March. 2020(\$1500.00).

Where did the DDF come from? Three years ago, District Rotarians generously gave to The Rotary Foundation (TRF) Annual Fund and half of those donations are returned to the District to match District Grants for great projects in our communities and in international communities as well.
