

Friends of Balboa Park



John Bolthouse presented a program on the efforts to improve and preserve Balboa Park.

Old Mission Rotary enjoyed an amazing program on Balboa Park at our August 13th meeting. Friends of Balboa Park was founded in 1999 by a group of longtime volunteers and is dedicated to initiating projects that the underfunded City of San Diego may never address. The Executive Director, John Bolthouse, presented a remarkable slide show documenting some of the projects completed over the years. Past park improvements include: -Restoration of the Lily Pond after it was vandalized by a flashmob of

 -Placement of information kiosks

ticket booths from the 1915 Pan-American exposition. Rotarian Jim Hughes of Club 33 personally made this project happen! The all-original Herschell-Spillman Carousel was recently purchased so it can remain permanently in the park. John thanked the Art Pratt Foundation for our recent grant to help with restoration of the carousel.

One very impoortant contribution over the years has been the funding for field trips for title one schools. This program has allowed 20,000 underprivileged school age kids to visit the park

Projects now in the works include:
-Building a fence and a shade platform to protect the massive Moreton Fig Tree

-Rebuilding of the long gone Palm Canyon bridge

Jackie Carpenter's husband, Jack, is a passionate member of the Friends of Balboa Park and is using is talents as an architect to design and build gateway monuments and to study and analyze parking and traffic circulation.

Balboa Park is home to more than 16 museums, multiple performing arts venues, lovely gardens, trails, and many other creative and recreational attractions, including the San Diego Zoo. John's program inspired Old Mission Rotary to re-engage with this San Diego treasure!

MusiCamp Youth Symphony



The annual International Youth Symphony is a partnership program between the San Diego Youth Symphony (SDYS) and Rotary District 5340 International Youth Exchange. The program just completed its 15th year of bringing musicians from across the globe together with the most experienced musicians of SDYS for a two-week intensive music experience. In July of 2019, 24 international musicians representing 10 countries joined SDYS students to create a unique orchestra, comprised of exceptionally talented student musicians led by SDYS Music Director Jeff Edmons. After two weeks of rehearsals and a variety of recitals and concerts, the grand concert of Beethoven and Mozart took place on Saturday, July 27th in Escondido.

The foreign students stayed with Rotarian host families including our very own Don and Susan Krupp. They shared their home with a cello player from Germany. The Rotary District ensures that the kids have fun and the group visited many San Diego attractions. Bob Self has been on the district committee for the International Youth Symphony for years and our club is very grateful to him for his service.
