San Diego Plan Climate Change



Our speaker on July 28 was Bill Powers who spoke about the City of San Diego's Climate Action Plan

Climate change is one of the greatest threats ever posed to human existence. What science makes overwhelmingly clear is that what we are doing is not enough to solve the problem, and we must find new solutions. We have a collective duty to protect public health and our quality of life for future generations, and that is the driving mission of our organization. Our speaker, Bill Powers is one of the country's most respected engineers in utility and energy resource management. He has shaped strategy to achieve renewable energy objectives for the country's leading public and investor-owned utilities. In San Diego, Mayor Faulconer said the climate action plan puts San Diego on track to meet state goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 2050 and sets a 100 percent renewable energy target by 2035, all while generating jobs in the region. . As an example, solar power is booming and there are 3000 installations a month in the city and the solar panel industry has created 64,000 jobs in San Diego.
