On August 2nd, Isabelle Demillian presented a program about Zero-Waste Groceries.

Isabelle had a career as an energy consultant and sustainability analyst, and decided to put her passion for environmental conservation toward opening a more sustainable grocery concept. She raised over \$35,000 through a successful KickStarter campaign and opened The Mighty-Bin in North Park.

Her grocery store offers a wide variety of bulk grocery items including nuts, beans, grains, cereals, baking products, oils, coffee, spices, dried fruit, produce, cleaning products and much more. Customers can purchase and carry home their purchases in paper bags, jars or other reusable packaging. Plastic packaging is thus eliminated. Isabelle is also committed to offering organic and healthy foods that are from sustainable sources.

He was particularly impressed by our club's dedication to The Thousand Smiles Clinic both with fund raising and staffing. Chuck was excited to distribute the new Rotary branded lapel pins. These include not only the Rotary wheel but the word ROTARY. When Chuck was getting dental work done, his hygienist, Jessica, saw the pin and asked him what Rotary was. A conversation was started and so Chuck invited Jessica to attend our Old Mission Rotary Club meeting!

One of Chuck's goals as District Governor is to place Peace Poles at high schools and universities around the district. A Peace Pole is a handcrafted monument that displays the message that "Peace May Prevail on Earth." He suggested that Old Mission Rotary could install one at Francis Parker School where we have an Interact Club.

Another goal is to increase charitable giving in the district by promoting legacy and estate plan gifts to the Rotary International Foundation. One major district focus this year will be mental health and specifically suicide prevention. Chuck is organizing a Rotary Action Group to find ways we can help. He became emotional as he expressed his desire to really make a difference here in our San Diego.

Old Mission Rotary was thrilled to welcome District Governor Chuck and we were most impressed with his sincerity and his devotion to Rotary and our San Diego community!
