

Matt Brennan of Collective Sun spoke to the club on September 1st.

Power BY the People is the business model of CollectiveSun! . The San Diego company uses the power of the community to help nonprofits raise the funds to achieve financial and environmental sustainability with solar power. Spokesman Matt Brennan explained how they work solely with nonprofits to help them overcome the challenges that they have in financing solar projects.

Because most of the current solar incentives are embedded in the tax code, they're not accessible by nonprofit organizations. In addition, banks and other financial institutions tend to shy away from funding loans for nonprofits. CollectiveSun saw this challenge as an opportunity to connect impact investors with nonprofit organizations by bringing these two groups together to fund solar projects '

The Medical Minute



Dr. Kevin Glynn regularly reports on the latest news in medicine. JAMA this week contained a report from the Food and Drug Administration regarding a new class of cholesterol lowering drugs. Alirocumab, trade name Praluent, is an antibody, injected every few weeks, that inhibits PCSK9, a protein that prevents the liver from removing LDL, ("bad") cholesterol from blood. Blocking the blocker lowers blood cholesterol. This is confusing, but is how it appears to work. Preliminary studies indicate major effect, with serum cholesterol levels lowered from 36 to 59 per cent. Trials are under way to learn whether Praluent can be given in addition to a statin. At this time it is expensive, \$560 per dose, which means a cost of \$14,000 per year. No one is sure yet where it will fit in the array of cholesterol lowering drugs.
