Most of our club members had no idea what a charter school is even though they are frequently in the news and are located in all of our neighborhoods.

Old Mission Rotarian Miles Durfee is the Managing Regional Director in Southern California for the California Charter Schools Association. Miles arranged this program on Tuesday, November 1st to educate us.

Our speakers came from two local charter schools located in Linda Vista. Sarah Saluta is the Executive Director of the San Diego Cooperative (K-8) Charter School and Demi Brown is the Executive Director at the Empower Charter School. Both

Sarah and Demi impressed all of us with their passion and enthusiasm for their students and schools. California's charter schools are public, tuition-free, and open to all students. They are public schools with rigorous curriculum programs and unique educational approaches. In exchange for operational freedom and flexibility, charter schools are subject to higher levels of accountability than other public schools. The key difference between a traditional public school and a charter school is that each charter school has its own Executive Director and Board of Directors. This frees them from the bureaucratic restrictions and red tape found in large school districts. San Diego charter schools are part of the San Diego Unified School District and Sarah and Demi had great praise for the support they receive. Nevertheless, the independence of their charter schools allows for flexibility and unique policies for their students and schools instead of being lost in a huge school district.

Teachers at charter schools are required to have the same credentials as teachers at any other type of public school in California. In San Diego County some 83,939 students attend 131 separate charter schools. This is one out of every five students.

These students include English learners (15%), students eligible for free lunch (55%) and students with disabilities (11%). 6% of the students are black compared to 4% in other public schools and 51% are Latino compared to 48% in other public schools.

The members of Old Mission Rotary were very impressed by the presentation and now understand what a charter school is and how it fits into the public school system.

Feeding San Diego's Kids is a program of International Relief Teams and has been incorporated into Old Mission Rotary Community Service. Children who are eligible for free breakfast and lunch programs at public schools frequently go hungry on weekends. The Feeding San Diego's Kids program provides nutritious food for a family of four for week-ends for homeless and at risk families. Food deliveries take place on Thursday mornings once a month from 9am to 11am.
