On Tuesday, August 16th, Rotary Foundation Chair, Mike Lewis, addressed the club about the good works and complex operations of the Rotary Foundation. He encouraged members to donate each month through the Rotary Direct program. A member that donates \$100 (\$10 per month) or more each year is a Paul Harris Sustaining member. Many Rotarians participate in the Foundation Endowment Program where funds from their estate are pledged to Rotary. The Rotary Foundation transforms our gifts into projects that change

lives across the world.
