#### STINE NIKOLAJSEN FROM DENMARK

### **And Her Year in the United States**

Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE) is a study-abroad opportunity for young people who spend anywhere from a few weeks to a full year as an international student hosted by local Rotary clubs. More than 8,000 students participate each year. They share their cultures, embrace new cultures and help foster global understanding. They learn a great deal about themselves and their host countries.

This week's speaker was none other than our "RYE Daughter from Denmark," Stine Nicolajsen. Stine gave a fun and fascinating presentation about her homeland, and shared some of her experiences as a Rotary Youth Exchange student here in the United States.

Stine began her presentation with some general facts about Denmark, which included a map showing its location in Europe, the size of its population (5.7 million), the most-commonly spoken languages (Danish, Norwegian, Swedish, German, and English), and a description of its educational system. She also shared that Denmark has the world's oldest monarchy, and talked about its parliamentary governmental structure and its current prime minister. Stine described some fabulous Danish traditions, including Sankt Hans, which involves a community bonfire for burning witches (symbolically, not literally), Jul (Danish Christmas), which spans the entire month of December and includes lots of food and dancing, and Nytar (Danish New Year), which involves jumping off furniture into the new year and "crazy fireworks"!

She also shared some Danish fun facts:

- The Danish alphabet has three more letters than the English alphabet
- It rains 170 days a year on average
- Denmark is the happiest nation on earth
- Demark's flag is the oldest in existence
- There are 5.7 million Danes, but 29 million pigs!
- Stine's hometown is Ringsted, population 30,000

Stine shared some pictures and memories from trips she has taken while living in the United States. Some destinations included San Francisco, Salt Lake City, Omaha, Lake Tahoe, Disneyland, Los Angeles, and Hawaii. Her final trip scheduled this summer will be a tour of the East Coast, where she plans on visiting New York, Washington DC, and several other cities.

Finally, Stine spoke about her host families, including the Larkins, the Krafts, and the McDonnells. All three families were in attendance to support Stine during her presentation, and all posed for pictures at the end of her talk. All in all, it was a wonderful speech given by a fantastic young lady!





## SUMMARY OF THE LATEST BOARD MEETING

## April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2016 Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Rotary Club of Fair Oaks

After our usual Secretary Minutes approved and Treasurer's Report approved, the Board approved two grant applications. One for the YMCA and one to provide funding for 2 kids from Fair Oaks for a Summer Camp program.

We are sponsoring a Little League Team with the Rotary Orangevale Club. There will be a Rotary Night, wearing Green & Gold. We'll be informed when that happens.

The Never-to-Late program was a success and we voted to continue the program in next year's budget.

Our MOU is now ready for Club approval and will be sent to all members to review and have a Club vote at the next meeting.

Membership continues to grow and we have a new member for approval, plus an Associate Member who wants to be a full member. Members who have not paid their dues will be contacted. We are also planning a special Mother's Day meeting on May 8<sup>th</sup> honoring our mothers and mothers-to-be.

We have several events coming up:

- Honeymooners next meeting is April 27<sup>th</sup> at Marlow's and have invited the new Board.

Maggie was excited to announce that our next Youth Exchange Student will be a boy from Brazil. He will be arriving in August. Stine will be leaving in mid-July.

Fred shared our goals so far:

- Annual Fund giving is at \$13,978 6<sup>th</sup> in the District.
- We are at \$176 per capita -- 15<sup>th</sup> in the District.
- Achieved our Polio Goal \$6000 2<sup>nd</sup> in District.
- We have 30 members in Rotary Direct.
- The Foundation combined the EREY and Sustaining Recognition to mean that "every member gave \$100".
- A new Club recognition has been added, the "100% Foundation Giving Club", which counts any donation to o the Rotary Foundation, including Annual Fund, Polio Plus, Endowment Fund, or an approved Global Grant. Clubs must exceed \$100 per capita to this collection of funds, and every member must donate at least \$25.
- District has a Million dollar challenge adding Annual, Polio Plus and Gates. As of March 1<sup>st</sup>, we are 4<sup>th</sup> in District.


