# Featured Speaker: Robert Sanger - Folsom Cordova Community Partnership

This week we welcomed Robert Sanger, the Executive Director of the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership to our meeting. Robert is a graduate of the California State University system and has a wife and two boys, Jacob and Riley. He has a passion for his work with this organization and his overriding goal is to see families succeed.

He shared with us all that this organization does for the families of the community. It's focus is meeting a families' needs by enhancing them through education, welfare and well-being to achieve their greatest potential.

The scope of the organization is broad so it encompasses its objectives through community support programs, youth programs, employment programs and home visit programs. It is important to help families reach self-sufficiency.

A large part of their resources are focused on crisis management, so they are prepared to help with emergency supplies of food, shelter, payments of utilities and a safe haven program.

They are able to do all of this through the other many programs they offer such as:

- 1. Effective parenting classes three different options of topics
- 2. Stress reduction groups
- 3. Fun family activities
- 4. Parent leadership programs

The parent leadership programs have been shown to be very successful and encompass home visits by FCCP staff, support groups, Domestic Violence services and Positive Disciplining courses.

For the organizations youth, there are many programs that allow the kids to get involved, stay engaged and learn while enjoying new friendships. Those programs are:

- 1. Group Mentoring Initiatives
- 2. Drug Free Communities
- 3. RC Youth Leadership Council
- 4. Growing Together (summer activities)
- 5. RC Youth Center (coming soon)

The FCCP also has programs and focuses efforts on helping families prepare for employment and creating job skills.

Last years the FCCP helped over 5,100 families, distributed over 9,750 diapers, gave out 1,177 bus passes and supported children with 175 backpacks with school supplies.

Their offerings are great and they serve a large population of needy families. All this is done through many different fundraising activities.



Thank you for being a Friend of the Fair Oaks Library. If you have ever had an interest in volunteering for the book sale - NOW is your chance! We welcome first-time volunteers as well as the old pros who return sale after sale. We need you all. No experience necessary. No heavy lifting involved (just single books). At each book sale, we make over \$2,000 that goes directly to the Fair Oaks Library services and programs.

Here is the list of times and job openings we need to fill:

**Friday, June 17, 2016, 9 am – 2 pm?** Setup. Volunteers will be unpacking boxed books and organizing the books in their specified areas. Volunteers can come in for only an hour or two or the entire time.

**Saturday, June 18, 2016, 9 am – 5 pm** We need 8 cashiers - 4 shifts of 2 hours each; 2 for each slot of 9am-11am, 11am-1pm, 1-3, and 3-5. Maybe also a few volunteers who will help restock the tables and tidy the books as items are sold, as well as to help shoppers find items and transport large purchases to their cars.

**Tuesday, June 21, 2016, 10am – 8pm**. We need 10 cashiers - 5 shifts of 2 hours each; 2 for each slot of 10am-noon, noon-2pm, 2-4, 4-6, and 6-8. Maybe also a few volunteers who will help restock the tables and tidy the books as items are sold, as well as to help shoppers find items and transport large purchases to their cars.

**Wednesday, June 22, 2016, 9 am – 2 pm?** Unsold books will be sorted and boxed up - either for use at the next book sale or to send to the Sacramento County Book Den. Volunteers can come in for only an hour or two or the entire time.

Volunteers get one free book of their choice for each hour they work!!
