## And the Vernal Pools of Mather Field

**Emily Butler** 

Our speaker for the meeting was Emily Butler from the local organization Splash-Sacramento. Emily is the Executive Director of Splash, which is a Sacramento non-profit organization dedicated to helping local children understand and value their natural world through science education and outdoor exploration. They believe that all children deserve the opportunity to learn and play in nature. They offer a variety of environmental science programs designed to introduce Sacramento-area kids to the wonders of science by teaching them about local habitats.

Specific premises and goals that led to the creation of Splash are:

- 1) Kids need Science
- 2) Vernal pools need protection
- 3) Mining operations surrounding vernal-pool areas do not work and are a detriment to their existence and the existence of the wildlife who live in and frequent the pools
- 4) The prevention of water pollution and getting government grants for same
- 5) Kids don't have outdoor access outlets, unlike the past.





Emily is the daughter of the founder, Eva Butler, who founded the organization in 1999. Her dedication and efforts have enabled local kids to visit outdoor locations in the area to learn more about nature, especially in our back yard, at the vernal pools of Mather Field. Some 90 classes of students will study in a 3 month curriculum numbering 13 lessons per class. Each student, at 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Levels, will adopt a vernal pool "critter" during that period becoming an expert on same.

Splash's goals include the following:

- 1) Build bridges to nature in our area and elsewhere
- 2) Inspire their students to become young scientists
- 3) Foster an atmosphere of enlightenment by discovery
- Foster future environmental stewardship by participating in the future in similar organizations



# SPLASH And the Vernal Pools of Mather Field

Emily went on to talk about Mather Field and how lucky we are to be able to easily visit one of the most prolific concentrations of vernal pools in the U.S. The 2016 vernal-pool season is almost completed. She advised the club, that if we are interested in completing a Club Field Trip in 2017, she would be happy to oblige. Just contact her soon.

The presentation was accompanied by a PowerPoint slide show, showing numerous pictures of the vernal pools at Mather, as well as classroom labs and excited students making discoveries. 








## **CLUB NEWS**
