

# International Team "Pre-Report"

Literally just off the plane from Peru, Fred & Alice Rowe, and Jim Cralle were invited to give the club a brief update on their trip to distribute wheelchairs.

The club, bubbling with serious questions such as: why Jim wasn't wearing a vest; and did Beth really think Fred was capable of giving a brief update; finally allowed our sleep-deprived travelers a chance to speak.

Fred, taking the mic first, explained that in Peru he was introduced as the President of the Rotary Club of California, and it wasn't clear he was ready to relinquish the title.

Taking a more serious tone, he shared how they had begun their journey on December 1st, arriving in Iquitos, Peru for the almost final phase of a year-long journey Fred and our club has led to deliver 176 RoughRider Wheelchairs.

Working with the Rotary Club of Iquitos, which the week before their arrival celebrated their 80th anniversary as a Rotary Club, our team consisted of ten people. In addition to Fred, Alice, and Jim, there were three Rotarians from the Rancho Cordova club, two employees from the RoughRider Wheelchair company, and two of Alice's friends.

It turns out Alice's friends were vital to the trip as one was bilingual and the other was a physical therapist.

We didn't know exactly what we would find, but we found the local club had (mostly) correctly assembled all the wheelchairs before we arrived.

We did split up one day when half the team flew to their destination and half the team, including Alice, took a boat up the Amazon to Requena.

Alice explained the trip to Requena took 2 hours by bus, waiting 2 hours there, then 3 hours by boat before arriving to give out 17 wheelchairs, with over half of them being polio survivors.



Jim shared a short story about his day of fishing, explaining he caught "a few fish" including the famed Peacock bass!



After congratulating Jim on his catch, make sure and ask him for his sunscreen recommendations when traveling in Peru and about his Piranha and Alligator stories!

Beth thanked the members of this International team and we look forward to when the full team will be able to come back and share the complete story.

We had about a dozen people show up for this tabletop networking and lunch.
