Global Polio Eradication Initiative

Rotary International - partnering with the CDC, UNICEF and WHO - have undertaken the daunting task to eradicate polio completely. Part of this initiative includes raising funding for medical supplies and obtaining the manpower for its implementation. Because of this humanitarian effort, the Global Polio Eradication Initiative has raised more 5 Billion dollars towards this cause (1.2B from Rotary International) and over 2 million children have been vaccinated.

From February 19-21, Rotarians from all over visited India to assist with the Country's "National Immunization Day" – an effort to eradicate polio completely. Because of the Rotary's efforts – as well as other organizations – India has only had **one** reported case of polio in 2011. Compare that to 1978, when India had 200,000 cases. Fred & Alice signed up at the International Convention in New Orleans and then received a confirmation email giving them only 6 weeks' notice!





A Few Facts

India is only 1/3 the size of the United States, but holds 4 times the population. It is considered to be the world's second fastest growing economy; however, over 50% of the nation's population is considered illiterate.

Polio is an abstract concept in the US, but the Rowes witnessed many people suffering from the long-term effects of this disease. Polio is only transmitted human to human via fecal matter, orally exposed. Polio is most commonly found in children under 5 years old, if they have survived that long. Remember – victims internationally do not get the treatment like in the US.

Statistically, if 200 individuals were infected with the polio virus, 185 would not show any symptoms, 14 would show "flu-like" symptoms, and 1 person would actually be paralyzed from it.

Political Issues

Muslim leaders originally believed that immunization as a concept was a "hatedriven persecution campaign" to sterilize Muslims. Muslim Rotary International members met with leaders personally, and now the Muslim communities support the immunization movement. Now, for 3 days twice a year, 172 million individuals are vaccinated at each event. In addition, 210 million houses are visited, and 8 million people are "in transit" receiving the vaccination. Some areas have 10 events per year! YES! Rotarians are making this happen!!! The Indian Rotarians were extremely energizing to the other Volunteers – and vice versa!!!



Team Members & The Trip

The fantastic and selfless people who made up the team came in many shapes and sizes. There were two 85-year olds and two father-son sets! From District 5180, we had 3 people (but the 3rd was a Dodgers fan...and a Cowboys fan!) Whether they were Rotarians or not, all helpers wore the Rotarian Yellow Vests!

The trip itself lasted 7 days. This included travel time, sightseeing (of course!) other touristy-type things such as tours of the facilities, different areas, hospitals and clinics, and 2-3 days devoted to National Immunization Day. <u>Here's the breakdown</u>:
Day 1: Assisted with children at a fixed location • Day 2: "Mop up" – going from house to house looking for children • Day 3: 2nd "Mop Up" house to house sweep.

Who Gets Inoculated?

This wonderful opportunity to receive an important vaccine did not come without its challenges. But unlike the US-required hurdles, parents were not present, may have been deceased, and consent forms did not need to be signed. Inoculations are not as effective in children with chronic diarrhea, since it does not stay long in their system. Ideally, the younger the child, the more he/she would benefit from the inoculation. To distinguish those that had received a dose, volunteers painted the child's fingernail with a purple marker, which would stay on the nail until it grew out. Alice was able to inoculate a 6 week old baby!!! Bear in mind that once a person is infected, there is no cure. The infection goes away (the individual doesn't remain contagious), but the damage is done and is permanent. Thankfully, there is no harm to "re-immunize."


