FOUNDATION AWARDS - CONGRATULATIONS ABOUND



In an amazing, heartwarming night, more than 80 Rotarians, Community Clubhouse to recognize 18 new Paul Harris Fellows, 20 multiple Paul Harris awardees, 5 Paul Harris Society members, 12 Rotary Foundation Benefactors, 2 new Bequest Society families and major donors Beverly and Howard Mark.

On hand to present these awards and talk about the work of the Rotary Foundation was an assemblage of dignitaries including Assistant District Governor Glenn Fong, District Foundation Chair and pa,st District Governor Clarence Parkins, District Annual Giving Chair Frank Woods, and keynote speaker Jean Irwin.

The occasion was, of course, our annual Foundation Recognition Night and most everyone was dressed in finery (exepting our dental doc). > While the Interact students served our meal and we dined, all were entertained and informed by keynote speaker, Jean Irwin, member of the Folsom Rotary Club and a 1989 Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar to Nottingham, England.

> Jean related unexpected ways in which her interactions as an Ambassadorial Scholar improved understanding, even between similar America and England cultures. She discussed her career as a teacher of persons with hearing impairments, where adapting insights from computer artificial intelligence enabled her to help her students turn "the inarticulateness of deafness in to self advocacy". Jean reported that 80 percent of her students go on to graduate from college.

> We learned that Rotary Foundation contributions fund the Ambassadorial Scholar program as well as polio eradication, Group Study Exchange, peace and conflict resolution, and development. Jean's presentation earned her a warm round of applause.

This past year our club This is a commitment of at least \$100 per year towards a Paul exceeded the minimums to qualify for this program. In fact, Harris. The contributions can be unrestricted or restricted. we exceeded our goal by 181 percent, with contributions totaling \$14,489, or \$315 per member. In addition, we also contributed \$5,576 to restricted funds such as Polio Plus and our own wheelchair project. So far this year we have contributed \$9587, or 106.5 percent of this year's goal.

Our club's remarkable performance will be recognized at the November 19th District Foundation Dinner. President Romines noted that we have ten reserved seats still open and unclaimed for the Dinner. See President Pete to sign up!

FAIR OAKS FOUNDATION REPORT

Fair Oaks Rotary Foundation Chairman Bob Walters gave a report on our club's own foundation. We fund our scholarship awards, speech contest, senior luau, RYLA, third grade dictionary project, Safetyville and other projects to the tune of \$8,000 each year. We presently have a total of \$136,000 in the Foundation coffers. The Foundation is funded through activities such as gourmet beer tasting at the Chicken Festival and the Fair Oaks Uncorked event, as well as special birthday and anniversary "happy fines.


