Horned Owl, and Digger, a little Burrowing Owl. As she carried the owls around the room on her glove, she told us about their program of saving wildlife and rehabilitating them back into natural surroundings whenever possible. Only they don't accept Prairie Dogs. They conduct educational programs and receive around 2,000 wildlife each year. Their facility, located at 3308 95th Street is open to visitors. The Rehab Center is non-profit and funded by donations only.



We enjoyed having you with us. Come back again soon. She had plenty to eat including a 14" diameter Texas-sized pancake which she gamely attacked.












