

At the **Club Assembly on August 1**, Metro will vote on the following proposed amendments to the club bylaws (ten days' notice required before voting, and you'll receive a separate email on this). Please call SarahLee if you have questions, or ask any board member.

- ++ <u>Article 3, Section 6</u>: *Minimum Qualifications*. A candidate for any elected position must have been a member in good standing of Metropolitan Lubbock Rotary Club for a minimum of one year as of the date of the election she/he assumes office and have had experience with Rotary activities beyond attendance at Rotary meetings.
- ++ Article 8: Avenues of Service: Replace New Generations with current RI term Youth
