
Fund Raising – Meat Tasting Again



Petch will fly in on AA 3169 at 2:30 pm on August 4. Everyone is welcome to greet her. She'll stay one week

each with Bill and SarahLee Morris, Caryl and Walter Smith, Bonnie and Paul Schwarzentraub, and Cal and Susan Brints. Then she'll leave on August 31.

Petch is no stranger to America. She was a Rotary Youth Exchange student in 2006-2007 to Tulare, California, where her host club was Tulare Rotary Club D5230 in California's Central Valley 50 miles south of Fresno. When she was in the first year at Chiang Mai University, Petch and her friends went to Florida under a work and travel program in March to May 2010. In Florida she worked at the Busch Garden theme park in Tampa. She also went to Hawaii with a Rotary Friendships Exchange group

(RFE) in April 2011 to visit Rotary clubs in D5000.

She enjoys playing the guitar and has a band with her friends in Thailand. She also plays on a basketball team made up of medical students. Her mom is a nurse and her dad is an electrical engineer. Her older sister studies medicine at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok and her younger sister is starting veterinary medicine study at Chiang Mai University, the same university where Petch studies, located in Chiang Mai in northern Thailand.


