President Walter Needs a Shave for \$1000






If "Pass the Hat" for the August 1 social raises \$1000 for the Rotary Foundation, President Walter will shave his beard.

Directions to Harwell Elementary at 4101 Avenue D




<u>Directions</u>: Heading south on I-27, exit at 34th Street and continue south on the frontage road on the west side of I-27. Turn left (east) on 42nd Street; go over I-27 and continue to Avenue D. Harwell Elementary School is on your left. The social event will be in the Outdoor Education Lab on the east side ("back side") of Harwell, located at the purple marker at 4101 Avenue D.

If you're heading north on I-27, exit at 50th Street and continue on the frontage road on the east side of I-27 to 42nd Street and turn right (east). Follow directions in preceding paragraph.
