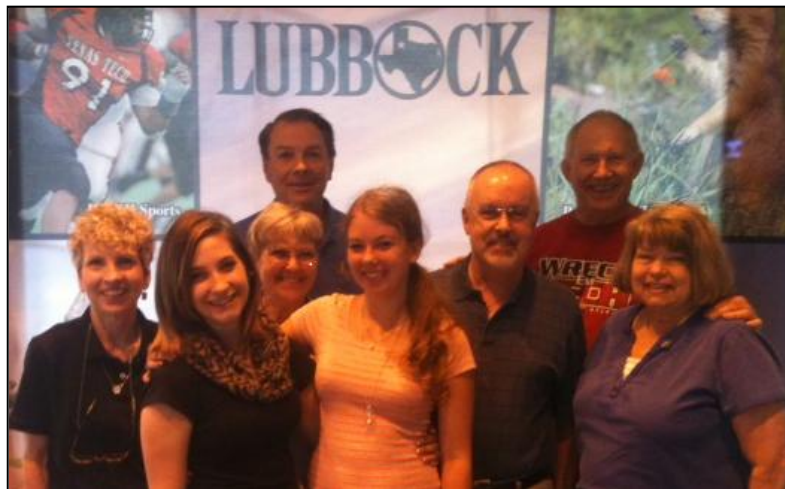
# Sunday, July 14, Open House at Smith's

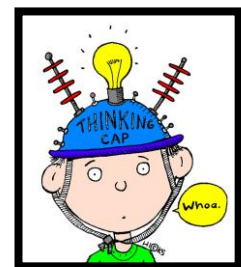

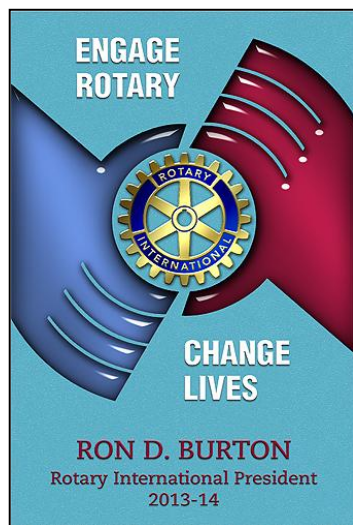

# July 24<sup>th</sup> at 6 PM – Beef Testing



We need 22 volunteers to test beef at 6 PM on Wednesday, July 24, on the Texas Tech campus. For an hour of your time, you'll earn \$25 for Metro's service projects.

Volunteers need to be:

1. at least 18,
2. American or U.S. resident,
3. eat beef at least once a week, and
4. willing to test beef cooked anywhere from medium rare to medium well

Volunteers can only do it once. They don't have to be Metro members. They can also be spouses, children who are old enough, neighbors, etc.

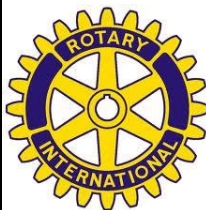
We need exactly 22 volunteers. If we have only 21, the test is called off and we receive no money. Caryl and Walter Smith and Kim Marin will attend as backups, just in case; but it might be good to have even a couple more backups.

If you know you can do this, please let Kim Martin know ASAP and she'll put you down and send you the details.

At the end of the test the volunteers will receive \$25 each in cash which we hope they will give to Metro. With this second test date, times 22 people per test, times \$25 per person yields \$1100 for Metro. Woo hoo moo!!!

Woo hoo moo??? That's a direct quote from Kim.

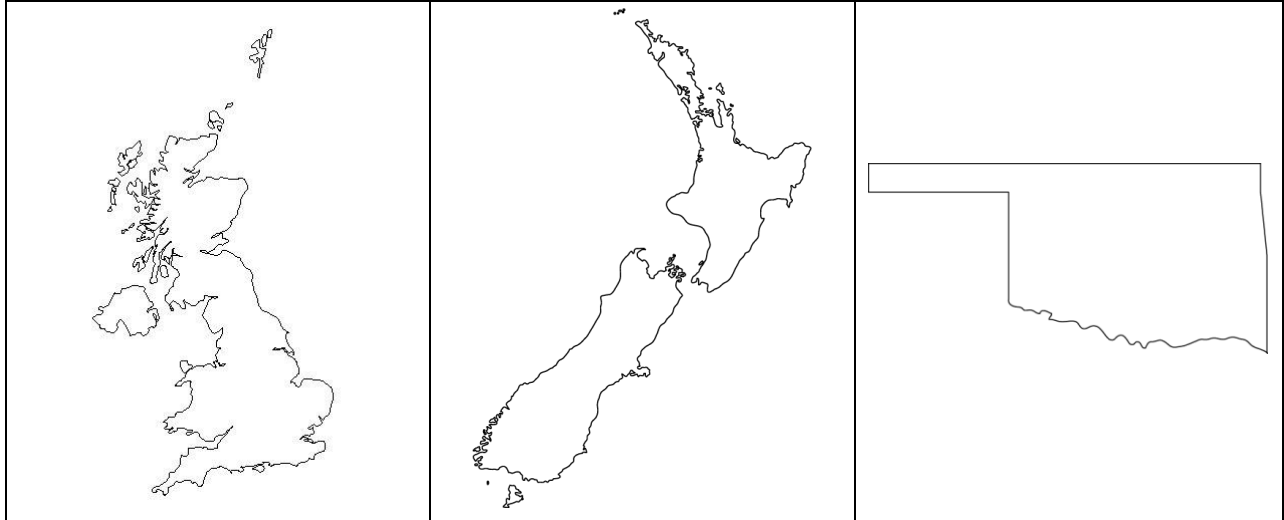

1. Talk with someone you'd like to invite to join Metro.
2. When he or she expresses an interest, fill out Part A of the "Membership Proposal Form" found at [http://www.rotary.org/RIdocuments/en\\_pdf/254en.pdf](http://www.rotary.org/RIdocuments/en_pdf/254en.pdf).
3. Give the completed form to Linda McMurry, Metro's Secretary.
4. After the Metro Board approves the proposed member, the Board will arrange to talk with the proposed member about membership in the club and ask her or him to fill out Part B of the "Membership Proposal Form."
5. Information about the proposed member will be published to club members; and if no objections are raised, after seven days the proposed member will become a member of Metropolitan Lubbock Rotary and the club secretary will report their membership to Rotary International.
6. The club president will arrange a formal induction ASAP at a club meeting.
