The American Legion was chartered and incorporated by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veterans organization devoted to mutual helpfulness. It is the nation's largest wartime veterans service organization, committed to mentoring youth and sponsorship of wholesome programs in our communities, advocating patriotism and honor, promoting strong national security, and continued devotion to our fellow service members and veterans.

Hundreds of local American Legion programs and activities strengthen the nation one community at a time. American Legion Baseball is one of the nation's most successful amateur athletic programs, educating young people about the importance of sportsmanship, citizenship and fitness. The Operation Comfort Warriors program supports recovering wounded warriors and their families, providing them with "comfort items" and the kind of support that makes a hospital feel a little bit more like home. The Legion also raises millions of dollars in donations at the local, state and national levels to help veterans and their families during times of need and to provide college scholarship opportunities.

The American Legion is a nonpartisan, not-for-profit organization with great political influence perpetuated by its grass-roots involvement in the legislation process from local districts to Capitol Hill. Legionnaires' sense of obligation to community, state and nation drives an honest advocacy for veterans in Washington. CELEBRATING OUR VETERANS

Paul Reyes from the American Legion told us there are 14,000 posts worldwide. Their motto is "Veterans helping veterans". It does not matter when you served, if you are a veteran in need, you will be



helped. They have a program called Boy's State and Girl's State. High schoolers are sent to Sac State for a week, and they learn about government at all levels. They also sponsor an annual picnic for veterans. This year they fed about 700 people (with the assistance of WalMart), and next year's picnic will be held on August 22nd. An example of their fundraising is a photo op session at Wild Wings, and they raised \$500. **Paul** made it a point to say "Welcome home" to **Tony David**, a Vietnam vet, and he gave **Tony** a poem written just for Vietnam vets.
