

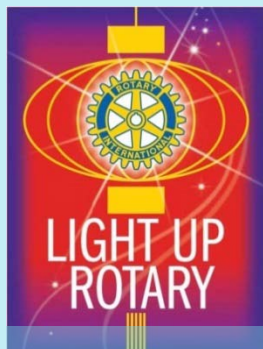

## A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Thanking our Veterans was just the right thing to do. I was especially touched by the "Welcome Home" given to Tony David by Paul Reyes of the American Legion. It is important to remember that the veterans among us have given up part of their lives to insure that we live in the best country on earth. The Program was about how the American Legion helps our Veterans and I thought you might like to know a little more about them.



The American Legion was chartered and incorporated by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veterans organization devoted to mutual helpfulness. It is the nation's largest wartime veterans service organization, committed to mentoring youth and sponsorship of wholesome programs in our communities, advocating patriotism and honor, promoting strong national security, and continued devotion to our fellow service members and veterans.

Hundreds of local American Legion programs and activities strengthen the nation one community at a time. American Legion Baseball is one of the nation's most successful amateur athletic programs, educating young people about the importance of sportsmanship, citizenship and fitness. The Operation Comfort Warriors program supports recovering wounded warriors and their families, providing them with "comfort items" and the kind of support that makes a hospital feel a little bit more like home. The Legion also raises millions of dollars in donations at the local, state and national levels to help veterans and their families during times of need and to provide college scholarship opportunities.

The American Legion is a nonpartisan, not-for-profit organization with great political influence perpetuated by its grass-roots involvement in the legislation process from local districts to Capitol Hill. Legionnaires' sense of obligation to community, state and nation drives an honest advocacy for veterans in Washington. The Legion stands behind the issues most important to the nation's veterans community, backed by resolutions passed by volunteer leadership.

The American Legion's success depends entirely on active membership, participation and volunteerism. The organization belongs to the people it serves and the communities in which it thrives. The American Legion is a great organization and one that could use our support.

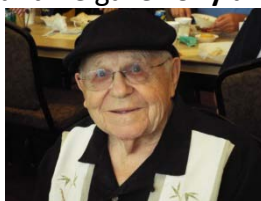

### CELEBRATING OUR VETERANS

**Paul Reyes** from the American Legion told us there are 14,000 posts worldwide. Their motto is "Veterans helping veterans". It does not matter when you served, if you are a veteran in need, you will be helped. They have a program called Boy's State and Girl's State. High schoolers are sent to Sac State for a week, and they learn about government at all levels. They also sponsor an annual picnic for veterans. This year they fed about 700 people (with the assistance of WalMart), and next year's picnic will be held on August 22<sup>nd</sup>. An example of their fundraising is a photo op session at Wild Wings, and they raised \$500. **Paul** made it a point to say "Welcome home" to **Tony David**, a Vietnam vet, and he gave **Tony** a poem written just for Vietnam vets.

Rotary International-**Bob Churchill** asked members to start their contributions if they haven't already, so we can continue toward our goal of \$5,000 for the year.

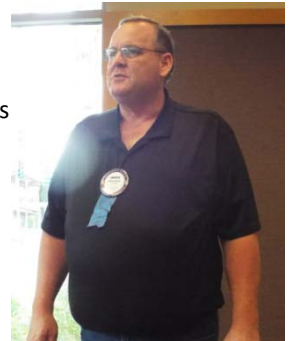

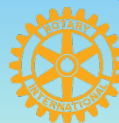
