

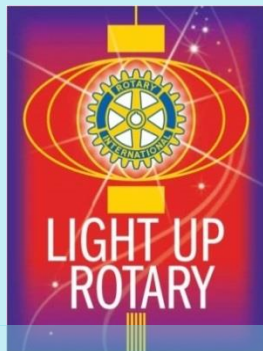

The Rotary year begins in July; in August we mark Membership Month, in September we celebrate New Generations, October is for vocational service, and so on, turning our attention to different topics that are important in Rotary.

## Crab Feed Justin Whitsell



- Tickets are \$45, and we need to sell 775 of them! **Doyle** sold the most last year. You can buy tickets through Eventbrite or by getting payment to **Justin**. **Justin** stated the club will absorb the service fee that Eventbrite charges this year. Drink tickets can be purchased in advance. Add-on packages will include: flowers, flowers and chocolate, or flowers, chocolate, and wine since the event is on Valentine's Day. We will charge a corkage fee (\$8) for those who bring in their own wine, but **Rich Hale** said we will post signs and discourage this practice.
- Wednesday, January 7<sup>th</sup>, at 9am will be a "Get Out Into Your Community" event. **Justin** wants teams to go out to the businesses in Citrus Heights and talk to them about Rotary and what we do. He would like the teams to also bring donation and sponsorship forms to get goods or cash to support the crab feed.
- **Tina Shaw** talked about the silent auction. She has a list of what was brought in last year and by whom, and she would like to know what everyone is bringing. She would like \$500 in value brought in by every member (can be solicited donations). **Tina** will need 6 people before the event to set up and 6 people in the room at the event.
- **Rich Hale** spoke about sponsorships. He really wants to go after the \$250 level (still putting the details together on what one gets at that level). He said the Roseville club's crab feed serves about 500 people but makes about \$30,000 more each year due to sponsorships.
- Desserts: **Laura Powell** said about 50 desserts would be a good number to have, but please no cupcakes. If you are buying a dessert to bring, please find out what it is (eg yellow cake with raspberry jelly filling) so it can be labeled. The labeled desserts went fastest last year.
- **Jennifer Riffe** is chairing the raffle and will need raffle sellers.
- **Mel Turner** said the wine raffle did not work well last year, so we are going back to the wine toss. People will get 3 rings for \$5 and toss the rings at the wine bottles. They win whatever bottle(s) the ring loops the neck of. This will be done before dinner. Each club member will be asked to provide 2 bottles of wine.
- Bars: **Mark Duncan** said the margarita machine is coming back this year, and we will have beer from DBI and Sierra Nevada. **Carroll Webb** will run the soda bar. The prices will be the same as last year.
- Fund in Need: **Ray** said we will have the Heads/Tails bead game like last year again, and the hope is that \$5000 will be raised for the cause (to be determined). We will have dedicated bead sellers this year so it will be more organized. The cost is \$10 per necklace.
- Ice cream cups? Yes, but someone will need to get them as **Mark Duncan** will be out of town. **Rich Hale** will get it covered.
- **Rich** said he is hoping that Sam's Club will donate the cost of soda, water, and ice. He and **Tina Shaw** will be approaching them.
- Live Auction: **Diane Riehle** found a fellow Rotarian who will be our auctioneer free of charge. Some of the items will be a **Colin Kaepernick** jersey like last year, and Rich hopes to get a **Madison Bumgarner** one also. We will have the helicopter ride, and another possible item is a set of two seats from Candlestick Park.
- **Bob Churchill** has the crab covered—he is not sure of the cost yet.
- **Jeff Slowey** asked about chicken, and he got nominated to be in charge of that.
- **Carlos Verrett** will be our DJ this year, which will save \$2100 for the club. He will take requests, unless it is "Freebird".
- **Justin** said if everyone logs into Clubrunner, click on "Member Area", "Organization", "Committees", and then "27<sup>th</sup> Annual Crab Feed" (under Club Service), then you can see all sorts of information about the crab feed that Justin has posted.
