<u>Program</u>: Bill Van Duker introduced Diane Riehle who then made a poignant introduction of our guest speaker and RYE Student from Switzerland, Sabrina Roth...Sabrina began with an overview of Switzerland with a population of 8 million people. She showed us maps of Europe and showed us where the Capitol Bern is located. She was especially mindful about telling us where Switzerland was located in relation to Sweden... Her town's population is around 4,000 people with a total of 4 schools. Sabrina explained that her hobbies were ice skating and singing and she also loves to bike/sled...You will have to have her explain how it works... She explained that the biggest difference she sees is in the

school system... She has completed her schooling in Switzerland where she attended 9 years of school and she will enroll in a three-year apprentice program in Public Transport when she returns this summer. We were also treated to a video phone call with Sabrina's twin sister... What fun it was to hear Sabrina speak to her sister in German and work to get her sister to speak to us in English... Very Cool... Here is more information about where our lovely RYE Student lives... enjoy... The Eiger village of Grindelwald in the Bernese Oberland lies embedded in a welcoming and green hollow, surrounded by a commanding mountainscape with the Eiger north face and the Wetterhorn. This mountainscape and the numerous lookout points and activities make Grindelwald one of the most popular and cosmopolitan holiday and excursion destinations in Switzerland, and the largest ski resort in the Jungfrau region. Thanks to its magnificent vista and the glacier which once reached right into the basin, Grindelwald attracted its first guests – primarily the English – from the end of the 18th century onwards. The actual breakthrough of Alpinism occurred in the mid 19th century, and local mountain guides climbed the peaks of the region with English tourists. The first ascent of the Eiger, the most difficult of Alpine mountains took place in 1858 (the north face only in 1938). Road and railway construction made Grindelwald much more accessible towards the end of the 19th century, which in turn also heralded the onset of winter tourism. The first cableway in the Alps was built here in 1908 on the Wetterhorn. And in 1912, a railway reached the Jungfraujoch via Kleine Scheidegg; today the «Top of Europe» still remains Europe's highest railway station and a world-renowned excursion destination within permanent snow and ice. There are 300 km of walking trails around Grindelwald. The high-altitude walk from Grindelwald-First along the Bachalpsee to the Faulhorn mountain hotel and then on to the Schynige Platte ranks among the most beautiful hikes of the region. An easy walk with fantastic views of the three, world-famous mountains of the Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau leads from the Männlichen up onto the Kleine Scheidegg. Special Yearly Events are: World Snow Festival - during the course of a week, Swiss and international teams of artists hew and construct figures and sculptures from metre-high snow blocks that have been provided --- (January). Velogemel" World Championship – every year a world championship on snow bikes takes place in Grindelwald, a speciality to Grindelwald (February). Snowpenair – Snow Openair, always held at the end of the winter season on the Kleine Scheidegg (March). Landart Festival – short-lived works of art are placed on the landscape using natural, local materials (June). Spring Mountain Festival – held annually on the Männlichen near Berghaus, with dances in traditional costumes, folk music and flag throwers (June/July). THANK YOU SABRINA...
