

#### A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Dear Citrus Heights Rotary Family, Point West Rotary has invited us to participate in an exciting bike ride downtown under the light of the full moon. Please join Jessica, Gail, Mark, Scott, and a few others Saturday, August 9th for a fun filled evening including food trucks, music and a moonlit ride through downtown Sacramento. #### **SPEAKER OF THE WEEK**

### CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES

Doug Carlson, who is employed by the California Department of Water Resources, spoke about the drought and the 4-way test.

There are several categories of drought: moderate, severe, extraordinary, and "pretty bad".

More than 1/3 of the state is in the worst



category. The average rainfall by this time of year is 50", and we are currently at 29". In 1923-24, it was 17.1". We are 1/3 the capacity of the larger reservoirs.

When talking about the drought, apply the 4 way test. Is the statement that this the worst drought ever true? No, but it is pretty bad. Also one "good" rainstorm is not going to save the water season. 13 of the 14 warmest years on record have been in this century, so climate change IS happening. He also applied the other ways of the 4 way test to damming water sources, providing a proper environment for fish species for their survival, and to farmers who invested their life savings into various crops that need a lot of water.






