As the Executive Director of Sacramento Navigators, Chris plays a pivotal role in assisting individuals facing homelessness and addiction. He helps to identify people in need, introduce them to the program, find them jobs with the ultimate goal of getting them off the street and into their own place to live, and with a stable job. They seek to empower individuals, restore dignity, and actively work towards rebuilding their lives for the betterment of themselves, their families, and the community.

Another very cool program he is involved with is brooms4bags.com Brooms 4 Bags provides brooms, bags, and cleaning supplies to unhoused individuals who want to clean their area. This has evolved so much that Home Depot is now sponsoring the materials for this project. By identifying and working with responsible individuals within the unhoused community, they provide cleaning supplies and reduce the health and safety risks associated with homelessness and drug addiction.

After the presentation, Chris did some brief Q&A and handed out prizes. Chris attributed his love of volunteering and community to his early days in the Salvation Army and



from a foundation set before him with how his parents and grandparents modeled similar behavior and volunteer efforts.

Dominic awarded him the Rotary octagon world paperweight as his speaker gift and closed effectively what would be his last regular meeting with a raise of the glass and a toast to Rotary around the World.


