Rotary makes high-quality health care available to vulnerable mothers and children so they can live longer and grow stronger.



Rotarians distribute clean birth kits and train health workers in safe delivery of babies. In the mountains of Poland, 26 children traumatized by violence get a chance to be kids again at Rotary camp where psychologists mix escape and therapy.



Clubs in Japan and Brazil used a Rotary Foundation global grant to equip a hospital with lifesaving neonatal equipment.

Rotarians expand access to quality care, so mothers and children everywhere can have the same opportunities for a healthy future. An estimated 5.9 million children under the age of five die each year because of malnutrition, inadequate health care, and poor sanitation — all of which can be prevented.

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

PP Marilee Monagan introduced our speaker Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert. Anne Marie is a career prosecutor with over 29 years of enforcement experience. Sacramento County Deputy District Attorney, she has spent most of her career prosecuting some of the area's most notorious and dangerous criminals murderers, rapists and child molesters. She has also created innovative programs for the District Attorney's Office focused on catching killers and criminals using DNA evidence, helping the children of our community by combating truancy, and honoring those citizens who provided service to justice with the development of the annual Outstanding Citizen Awards.

One of **Anne Marie's** passions is the pursuit of justice through forensic DNA evidence and cold case prosecution. She formed the DA's Cold Case Prosecution Unit in 2002, served as its first prosecutor, and is a nationally recognized expert on forensic DNA.

Anne Marie was elected as Sacramento County's District Attorney in 2014 and was sworn into office in January 2015. Since taking office, one of her first priorities was to create the Government and Community Relations Bureau, whose include: programs Speakers Citizen's Academy, Youth Academy, Youth Criminal Justice Shadow Day, Reading Partners. Her office has created a unit to deal with animal cruelty issues and she is also actively involved, along with Rotary District 5180 and other nonprofit organizations, with the issue of Human Sex Trafficking in Sacramento County. During her career as a prosecutor, **Anne Marie** has been recognized by her peers with the Prosecutor of the Year Award.

Since her election, she has been committed to providing the highest level of public safety through prosecution, prevention and innovation.

Anne Marie began by talking about a case she could not talk about last year when she was here. She received the call that they had made the DNA match the day of last year's meeting on April 23, The East Area Rapist/Golden 2018. State Killer, Joseph DeAngelo was arrested on April 24, 2018. DeAngelo was initially charged with two counts of murder with special circumstances. An amended complaint was filed in Sacramento Superior Court on August 21, 2018, combining cases from Sacramento, Contra Costa, Orange, Santa Barbara, Tulare and Ventura counties. The cases will be prosecuted jointly in Sacramento, where **DeAngelo** is currently charged with a total of 13 counts of murder and the special circumstances of murder during the course of burglary, murder during the course of a rape and multiple murders as well as 13 counts of kidnapping for robbery.

Anne Marie explained how using genetic genealogy in criminal cases has revolutionized fighting violent crime. The first case to use this tool (Golden State Killer/East Area Rapist) to the general process, other successful cases across the nation, training other jurisdictions and implementing a best practices model. They initially thought about the idea of using genetic genealogy in a

criminal investigation. She then explained the general process of how to do IGG (from DNA evidence to tree building), how the core team (Team Justice) worked together and the learning curve involved. Once a suspect is identified, **Anne Marie** explained how traditional police work takes back over at that point to make sure they have the right suspect. She talked about how, since the Golden State Killer case, a number of jurisdictions across the nation have also successfully used IGG, proving IGG is a viable investigative tool.

Following her presentation, **Anne Marie** fielded questions from those in attendance.

Join fellow cyclists for a fun day of riding, friendship and food while supporting the eradication of Polio.


