Rotary makes amazing things happen, like:

Mobile prenatal clinics:

Haiti has the highest maternal and infant mortality rate of any country in the western hemisphere. Rotary provided a fully equipped medical Jeep to volunteers and midwives to reach mothers and children in remote areas.

Cancer screening

Rotarians provided a mobile cancer screening unit and awareness trainings around Chennai, India, where there is a high mortality rate of women with breast and cervical cancer due to late diagnosis.

Preventing injuries and deaths

Rotary members launched a \$3 million, five-year pilot to <u>save lives of mothers and children</u> during home deliveries in Nigeria. Since 2005, they've also repaired 1,500 obstetric fistulas — 500 more than their initial goal — restoring dignity and hope to vulnerable mothers.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

PP Dominic Mecklenburg introduced Dr. Lee T. Lovallo. Dr. Lovallo has extensive experience in early music, dating to his founding Principia Musica, the Medieval-Renaissance ensemble at California State University, Bakersfield in 1978. He established the annual series of Evensong performances in Sacramento 1982-1987 for which he edited and directed music of Orlando Gibbons. Since 2006 **Dr. Lovallo** has directed Renaissance Choir Sacramento for which he edited and led performances of Ockeghem's Missa cuiusvis toni and directed a wide range of 15th and 16th century choral works. He is active as an organ builder, specializing in historical style tracker pipe organs and serves as organist and as music director at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Antelope. Following graduate work in music at SUNY Buffalo where he earned a Ph.D. in music, Dr. Lovallo taught choir and music history in high schools and colleges in Northern California, recently took part in the Tallis Scholars Summer Course, the Musica Antica a Magnano seminar, and the San Francisco Early Music Society Medieval/Renaissance summer program.

About the Choir

Formed in the summer of 2011 as the Antelope Renaissance Choir, we changed our name to reflect more closely the area where we live and perform. Renaissance Choir Sacramento specializes in singing motets and Masses of the 15th and 16th centuries. The Choir is organized as a 501(c)3 non-profit, educational institution. While much of our music is performed a capella, where appropriate viols, lute, organ and other instruments are occasionally added to the

texture. Prospective singers should have choral experience, read music and know the rudiments of music theory, be able to sing a range of 1-1/2 octaves with good intonation and tone quality without vibrato, have some acquaintance with European languages and Latin, possess sufficient keyboard or other instrument to help learn their music. and most importantly share our great enthusiasm for the fine, sublime music of the Renaissance.

We are not a church choir per se, but we do sing mostly sacred music, rehearse in the lovely chapel -like space of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Antelope occasionally using its late Renaissance-style pipe organ, and perform in various churches and other venues throughout the Sacramento area. Membership in the choir is open to all with no requirement as to religion.
