HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

IPP **Patrick Magnani** introduced **Chris Evans**. **Chris** explained what a 'Property Business Improvement District (PBID)' is and how they came to be formed.

The Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994 gave California cities and counties the authority to form self-assessing districts in order to generate revenue for maintenance, security and other services through property taxes. the funds will provide a safer and cleaner environment, which will ultimately attract more customers. Chief among the concerns of business and property owners in voting in favor of the PBID is reducing crime and homelessness in their communities.



The property owners in the Antelope area successfully make the case for the Antelope PBID, which the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved on July 17. In all, 75 businesses and 44 property owners make up the new PBID. In January 2019, the nonprofit Antelope Business Community was formed to allocate funds raised by the Antelope PBID.

Rebekah Evans, **Chris's** wife is Executive Director of the 80 Watt District a 'Property Business Improvement District (PBID)'. The goal of the district is to improve the area

within the boundaries with safety & security, beautification and maintenance programs and then marketing & promotion of the area. The economic vitality is the upmost importance to the businesses and we strive daily to make it a better place to live and own a business.

It is no secret the Watt Avenue Corridor, around the Watt and Interstate 80 interchange and the surrounding areas, has had its share of challenges. With everything from prostitution (human trafficking), to gang related crimes and more, the area historically has not had a very good reputation – that is until now. While it has taken an almost 4 year process, the property and business owners in the area, with help from Sacramento County Supervisor Susan Peter's office, decided to take a stand against these challenges and form the Watt Avenue Partnership (WAP). Services financed by a PBID are intended to enhance and supplement existing county services. Some of the services like those for additional security in the surrounding area along with maintenance services to keep the area clean and vibrant. Thanks to the combined efforts Sacramento County, as well as the WAP contracted Clean team, and the Sheriffs Work Program, the streets within the district look fresh and welcoming. In addition, the presence of Deputies from the Sheriffs Off Duty program and the WAP contracted private security patrols, the Watt Avenue area is making a much needed turn for the better.

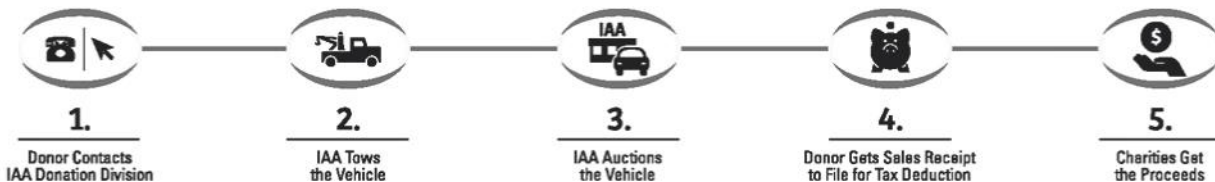
